Closing of Rue Simpson and Next Steps

We wish to inform you that Rue Simpson will soon be closed at Rue Sherbrooke to allow for excavation work to rehabilitate the sewer main in this sector.

Starting on January 8, 2011, Rue Simpson will be closed at Sherbrooke until May 2011. Rue Simpson will remain open to traffic for the duration of the work, with one lane open for both directions.

Parking

Because Rue Simpson is too narrow, for safety reasons and to facilitate snow removal operations, there will be no parking on the eastern side for the duration of the work. The parking permit zones on that side of the street will be relocated to the western side of the segment. We ask you to pay careful attention to the new parking signs.

Work has resumed after the holidays

Starting on January 8, the rehabilitation of the sewer main on Rue Sherbrooke between Saint-Marc and De la Montagne has started up again. This work will continue until May 2011. Because these operations affect a wider portion of the road, certain restrictions will be in effect and measures will be implemented to keep the area clear for work crews:

- East of Rue Mackay, one lane will be kept open to traffic in both directions;
- On Rue Sherbrooke between Saint-Mathieu and Mackay, a single lane will be kept open for traffic heading west;
- There will be no parking on Rue Sherbrooke between Saint-Marc and De la Montagne, but drop-off and delivery zones will be allowed on Rue Sherbrooke between Mackay and De la Montagne and between Saint-Mathieu and Saint-Marc;
- There will be no parking on this portion of Rue Sherbrooke, but dropoff areas will be authorized.

Work on Côte-des-Neiges Road

Starting on January 8, due to work taking place on Côte-des-Neiges Road, only one lane will be kept open to traffic, heading north, between Lincoln and Selkirk. There will be no parking on this portion of Côte-des-Neiges Road. We ask you to pay careful attention to the new signs that will be installed.

Public transportation

Until January 8, bus service from the Société de transport de Montréal will take place as usual. When the work resumes, certain bus routes may be diverted. For more information on schedule changes, call STM-INFO (514-786-4636).
