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The Church of St. Andrew and St. Paul was built in 1931-32. Two congregations, St. Andrew's founded in 1803, and St. Paul's founded in 1832, joined together in 1919. This is the Regimental Church of The Black Watch (Royal Highland Regiment) of Canada, whose colours hang in the sanctuary. The church organ is a four-manual 1932 Casavant (completely rebuilt in 2000) with 112 ranks and 7000 pipes spread over eight divisions, located in the chancel and the gallery.

## Music in Worship: Sunday, September 23, 2018

### **Anthem: Os justi**

Anton Bruckner (1824–1896)

Os justi meditabitur sapientiam: et lingua ejus loquetur judicium. Lex Dei ejus in corde ipsius: et non supplantabuntur gressus ejus. Alleluia. Inveni David servum meum, oleo sancto meo unxi eum. Alleluia.

*The mouth of the righteous utters wisdom, and his tongue speaks what is just. The law of his God is in his heart: and his feet do not falter. Alleluia.*

### **About this morning's organ and choral music...**

**Meditabor** is one of four motets for six voices published as Opus 133. It combines the rich chordal writing typical of 19th-century German choral music with deft counterpoint, in a Romantic reinterpretation of the great 17th-century masterworks of Heinrich Schütz (1585-1672). **Josef Rheinberger** hailed from the principality of Liechtenstein, but spent most of his career at the Munich Conservatory, and as court conductor from 1877. In Munich he taught many future musical titans such as Wilhelm Fürtwängler and Engelbert Humperdinck. His choral works, along with Bruckner's, are the best representatives of late-Romantic, German Catholic sacred music.

**Os Justi** was composed by **Anton Bruckner** in 1879. It is dedicated to Ignaz Traumihler, choirmaster of St. Florian Abbey, a monastery town where Bruckner lived and trained until his middle age. The first performance occurred on the feast of Saint Augustinus under Traumihler's baton, with Bruckner at the organ. Setting two verses from Psalm 37, **Os Justi** is the Gradual at Feasts of Doctors of the Church – learned theologians responsible for formulating Christian theology. Musically, the piece appears simple but contains much learned counterpoint. The altos start the setting of the words 'et lingua emus...' only to be followed after 2 bars by the trebles exactly a 5th higher, and then the basses and tenors. The strictness of the counterpoint serves as a musical metaphor for those who have contributed to sacred learning.

This morning's organ prelude and postlude are both made-in-Canada, but reflect strong Germanic influence. **Healey Willan (1880-1968)** is often called the Dean of Canadian Church Musicians. Following his Germanic training in England, he came to Toronto in 1911; his musico-liturgical work at the Anglo-Catholic Church of St. Mary Magdalene set the standard for several generations of Canadian church musicians. His **Chorale**

**of Preludes, Set II** are arrangements in a Brahms-influenced manner of six well-known German hymns.

**Rachel Laurin (b. 1951)** is a prolific Canadian composer and virtuoso organist. For many years Associate Organist of St Joseph Oratory in Montreal, her works reflect the influence of the French Symphonic school, of which she is an outstanding interpreter. The **Prelude and Fugue in F minor, op. 45**, goes well beyond French influences and reflects the style of the great German fugue writers, most directly Max Reger (1873-1916). Overall, the work is a winning combination of charming melodic writing, orchestral coloration, contrapuntal sophistication, and a blazingly virtuosic conclusion. - *JO*
