The Church of St. Andrew and St. Paul was built in 1931-32. Two congregations, St. Andrew's founded in 1803, and St. Paul's founded in 1832, joined together in 1919. This is the Regimental Church of The Black Watch (Royal Highland Regiment) of Canada, whose colours hang in the sanctuary. The church organ is a four-manual 1932 Casavant (completely rebuilt in 2000) with 112 ranks and 7000 pipes spread over eight divisions, located in the chancel and the gallery.





"They Cared: Canadian Nurses and the Great War"

Military nursing had its beginnings in the Crimean War, although the tradition of alleviating the sufferings of soldiers is an old one. The organizing of battle nursing and the dispatch of women as nurses, begun by Florence Nightingale for the British, soon found its way to Canada. It was in 1885 when Canada's Nursing Sisters first took to the field, providing care to the Canadian troops sent to put down the North-West Rebellion.

Over the years, the devotion and efficiency of Canada's military nurses have earned them a very high reputation among the troops with whom they served and to whom they ministered.

The role and contributions of Canadian nurses in WWI will be explored and discussed by Chantal Clabrough, M.A. McGill, social science teacher at Westmount High School and the developer of educational materials for the Je Me Souviens education program, a collaboration between the Royal Montreal Regiment, Canada Company and le Royal 22ieme Regiment (R22eR) in Quebec City." All are welcome at the next **Lunch and Learn**, on Remembrance Day, today, **November 11** after the Service at the Church of St. Andrew and St. Paul.

About this morning's choral and organ music...

Today is the 100th anniversary of the Armistice that ended World War I, a war of that destroyed lives and property on an unprecedented scale; even our own church community here at St. Andrew and St. Paul experienced massive losses.

Basil Harwood (1859-1949) retired early from prominent teaching and cathedral positions, the last at Christ Church, Oxford, who spent his last years composing on his family estate. *Requiem aeternam* is a solemn three-part tableau: the outer sections suggest a slowly-approaching funeral procession, which then disappears into the distance. The middle section is a harmonized setting of the traditional Gregorian chant from the Mass for the Dead, the Requiem.

Dominick DiOrio is Associate Professor of Conducting at the University of Indiana, and a prolific composer whose works are performed internationally. *I am* is an atmospheric setting of Frye's eloquent poem; the words "I am" return in slow, quiet chords sung by the choir as a kind of refrain, while the solo soprano carries the full poetic text.

Gabriel Fauré's Requiem is one of the best-loved settings of the Mass for the Dead. Fauré's gift for melodic writing and harmonic colour shine through; his own detached attitude towards the Christian faith (very much in keeping the society of with his time) tends to mute the stronger elements of the text in favour of beauty and elegance.

Charles-Marie Widor (1844-1937) served for 64 years as the unofficial yet de facto organist of the great Baroque church of St Sulpice in Paris, with its mighty symphonic Cavaillé-Coll organ. The opening movement of his *Symphonie VI* is one of the most iconic moments amongst his ten organ symphonies, and is reminiscent of the martial spirit of La Marseillaise.

Next in music at St. Andrew and St. Paul...

This Sunday, November 11 at 3:00 p.m., we are thrilled to host the Opéra de Montréal's series *Let's talk opera!*, a stimulating exploration of the Opera's upcoming production of *Das Rheingold*. Musicologist Pierre Vachon is joined by singers and guests. Plot, music, voices, cultural context, composer... everything you ever wanted to know! In Kildonan Hall, free admission.

On Sunday, November 18, we celebrate the music of Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750) by singing two of his choral motets during the morning service: *Komm, Jesu, komm*, and *Singet dem Herren ein neues Lied*. The organ voluntaries are of course also works by the most famous composer for the instrument!

Friday, November 23 at 7:30 p.m.: Annual Benefit Concert for the **Maison du Parc**, one of Montreal's last AIDS hospices. This year our choir and members of the Montreal Symphony Orchestra Players' Association are conducted by Maestro Jean-Sébastien Vallée in a gender-bending performance of **Handel's Messiah**. Have you ever wondered how "Rejoice greatly" would sound sung by a tenor? Or "The Trumpet shall sound" sung by a contralto? Transportation costs for our Syrian Refugee families

Thanks to the very generous financial support from our congregation, all the necessary funds - barring any unforeseen event - to furnish, house, feed and equip our Syrian refugees families for the first twelve months were raised prior to their arrival.

The initial fundraising did not take into account the money that would be required to cover their airfares. While we knew that there would be this additional expense, we could not predict its amount. The invoices, amounting to \$9,288.84, from the International Organization for Migration arrived mid-summer.

The Refugee Sponsorship Core SubCommittee is planning a targeted fundraiser for later this spring to cover this expense; but, should you wish to make a contribution prior to the end of 2018, your cheque, made out to The Church of St Andrew and St Paul and marked 'Syrian Refugee Fund' will be gratefully acknowledged and a tax receipt issued.
