The Church of St. Andrew and St. Paul was built in 1931-32. Two congregations, St. Andrew's founded in 1803, and St. Paul's founded in 1832, joined together in 1919. This is the Regimental Church of The Black Watch (Royal Highland Regiment) of Canada, whose colours hang in the sanctuary. The church organ is a four-manual 1932 Casavant (completely rebuilt in 2000) with 112 ranks and 7000 pipes spread over eight divisions, located in the chancel and the gallery.



About this morning's choral and organ music...

Michael Hurd's setting of Psalm 148 is typical of much mid-20th century English organ and choral writing: a spare harmonic language, lively, syncopated accompaniment with room for orchestral colouring from the organ; and a good, idiomatic declamation of the psalm text.

Henry Purcell is the defining figure of the early Baroque era in England. His operas, instrumental and keyboard music all set the standard until the arrival of Handel from Germany in the 18th century. *O God, the King of Glory* is an early anthem, written in a somewhat old-fashioned homophonic style reminiscent of Tye and Tallis. However, the occasional spicy chromaticism and deft text-setting are hallmarks of the composer's later, more elaborate style.

A native of Wales, **Paul Mealor** pursued composition from an early age, studying privately with William Matthias, and then at the University of York and at the Royal Danish Academy of Music. He now teaches composition at the University of Aberdeen. Mealor rose to worldwide fame when *Ubi caritas* was personally chosen by Prince William to be performed during his wedding to Miss Catherine Middleton in 2011. A homophonic work, *Ubi caritas* brought a mystical flair to the ceremony with its delicate sequences of ninth and seventh chords.

Maurice Duruflé (1902-84) was arguably the last of the great line of French Symphonic organist-composers, an artistic golden age that began with César Franck (1822-1890). Duruflé's oeuvre is small - only around a dozen works - but each one is of the highest quality. The *Suite, op. 5*, wears its majestic symphonic pedigree proudly, particularly in the brooding *Prélude* and bravura *Toccata*, as its grand, bell-like theme rings out in the pedal. -*JO*




Come share in the Pageant weekend!
