



## Calling All Singers to “Reach out with Music”!

The Church of St. Andrew and St. Paul was built in 1931-32. Two congregations, St. Andrew’s founded in 1803, and St. Paul’s founded in 1832, joined together in 1919. This is the Regimental Church of The Black Watch (Royal Highland Regiment) of Canada, whose colours hang in the sanctuary. The church organ is a four-manual 1932 Casavant (completely rebuilt in 2000) with 112 ranks and 7000 pipes spread over eight divisions, located in the chancel and the gallery.



## Music in Worship: February 24, 2019, Heritage Sunday

### Introit: *Jubilate Deo* in C

Benjamin Britten (1913-1976)

O be joyful in the Lord, all ye lands, serve the Lord with gladness and come before his presence with a song. Be ye sure that the Lord he is God:

It is he that hath made us, and not we ourselves; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture.

O go your way into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise; be thankful unto him, and speak good of his Name.

John Stainer (1840-1901)

How beautiful upon the mountains

are the feet of him that bringeth good tidings,

that publisheth peace; that publisheth salvation;

that saith unto Zion, Thy God reigneth!

—*Isaiah 52:7*

### About this morning's choral and organ music...

**Sir Charles Hubert Hastings Parry** was born to wealth and privilege, but worked hard to develop what he had been given. In addition to his large compositional oeuvre, he was an influential teacher and author, and was for many years Principal of the Royal College of Music in London. His students included Elgar, Vaughan Williams and Ireland, to name only a few. His chorale preludes are an English take on what was at the time a distinctly German idiom, though Parry makes full use of the early 20th-century English organ's orchestral colour palette.

**Benjamin Britten** is arguably the greatest English composer of the 20th century. His ebullient setting of *Psalm 100, Jubilate Deo*, is formally concise and balances the extrovert and introvert facets of the psalm text in masterful fashion. The organ's sprightly opening rhythmic ostinato evokes bells, while the choir's contemplative middle sections evoke Anglican psalm chant, a staple of the morning liturgy (Mattins) for which the piece is written.

**Sir John Stainer** is today best known as composer of *The Crucifixion*, a Passiontide oratorio. He began his musical career as a boy soprano at St. Paul's Cathedral, London, eventually returning there as choirmaster and organist, and reviving that great church's music ministry. Following his retirement from St. Paul's he was appointed professor of music at Oxford. *How beautiful upon the mountains* is a full anthem in the spirit of Felix Mendelssohn and Samuel Sebastian Wesley, mixing lush harmonies with an elegant sense of counterpoint, all in service of the text.

Blind at birth, **Jean Langlais** (1907-1991) was a prominent teacher and composer, and for many years was organist at the Church of Ste Clothilde in Paris, where César Franck (1822-90) had been organist. *Fête* is a jolly and aptly-titled fanfare that wears its French symphonic pedigree proudly. - *JO*
