

The Church of St. Andrew and St. Paul was built in 1931-32. Two congregations, St. Andrew’s founded in 1803, and St. Paul’s, founded in 1832, joined together in 1919. This is the Regimental Church of The Black Watch (Royal Highland Regiment) of Canada, whose colours hang in the sanctuary. The church organ is a four-manual 1932 Casavant (completely rebuilt in 2000) with 112 ranks and 7000 pipes spread over eight divisions, located in the chancel and the gallery.

Choral Music Texts: Black Watch Sunday, May 5, 2019

About this morning's choral and organ music

Sir Charles Hubert Hastings Parry was born to wealth and privilege, but worked hard to develop what he had been given. In addition to his large compositional oeuvre, he was an influential teacher and author, and was for many years Principal of the Royal College of Music in London. His students included Elgar, Vaughan Williams and Ireland, to name only a few. *I was glad* is arguably THE iconic English Victorian choral work, composed for the coronation of Edward VII at Westminster Abbey in 1902; it has been sung at numerous royal occasions since, most recently at the wedding of Prince William and Kate Middleton. *My soul, there is a country* (1915) is from a touching collection titled "Songs of Farewell". It represents a simpler aesthetic than *I was glad*; the Infant Christ, far "above noise and danger", is depicted in a child-like triple metre evocative of a Christmas carol; the opening and closing texts that aspire to the eternal are imbued with a characteristically Romantic yearning; the final list of Divine virtues are set emphatically, on strongly separated chords.

Edwin H. Lemare (1865-1934) was a rock star amongst the organists of his generation. A native of Ventnor, Isle of Wight, he studied at the Royal Academy of Music before obtaining a series of increasingly prestigious church and town hall posts in England, culminating in St Margaret's, Westminster. From 1900 he was primarily active in the United States, holding posts in Chattanooga, Portland, Chicago and San Francisco. In 1915, he was paid \$100,000 by the Austin Organ Company to play a series of 100 recitals at the Panama Pacific Exhibition, which were attended by more than 150,000 people. Lemare was a great improviser and interpreter who was renowned for his arrangements of orchestral music for the organ. He composed many original works for the organ including two symphonies and numerous lighter character pieces. The symphonies are in a Brahmsian mold, while the character pieces reflect the influence of salon music of the day. *-JO*

“I served under those Colours”: The Colours of the Black Watch

The Colours of the Black Watch are a prominent part of today’s Black Watch service. No ordinary flags, they represent the heart and soul of the Regiment, to be defended at all cost, in memory of all those who have served and have died in the service of their country and regiment. In protecting and guarding them, the Colour Guard that accompanies them (soldiers with rifles and bayonets) symbolically protects and guards the memory and sacrifice at the core of the Regiment.

On the parade to the Church, the Colours are guarded by the Colour Guard right into the back of the sanctuary. Symbolically, once in the Church, they are safe. The Colours are then marched forward, unguarded, to the Chancel. Since colours are consecrated, placing them on the Communion table is a most reverent act, in effect re-dedicating them to God for blessing. Church Parade is thus often very emotional for current soldiers, for it makes them realize that they are now responsible for perpetuating the Regiment’s traditions and history, in this way keeping faith with all of the soldiers who have served and died before them.

The Colours being placed on the Communion table today were presented by HRH Prince Charles in November 2009. Tradition holds that old colours are retired to the Church where they hang until they disintegrate. The oldest of the Black Watch Colours (those closest to the front) were presented in 1862.


