SEVENTY-FIVE YEARS AGO: We began with D-Day and the death of church member Lieutenant Donald Stalker. There followed the costly battles to free Normandy and open the way to Paris. The Black Watch (RHC) of Canada arrived in France early in July 1944 and was soon under fire. Less than ten days before the heroic but tragic Battle of Verrieres Ridge the regimental padre, Captain R.J. Berlis, became the first Black Watch officer to be wounded in France. Struck down as he was burying the fallen, the hearing in one ear was permanently damaged. Padre Berlis continued to serve throughout the war.

In 1946, R.J. Berlis was called to be minister of St. Andrew and St. Paul, in succession to The Reverend George Donald. He had served as assistant minister in 1939. Major Donald had seen duty as a chaplain in all his ministries: in India, in France and since 1925 in Canada with the Black Watch whose bitter losses in World War II weighed heavily upon him. George Donald's last official act was the restoration of the regiment's colours to the church in 1946.

Chaplaincy has played an important role in the lives of a great number of **our ministers down through our history**. We remember especially those who served at the front: The Reverends George Donald, Bruce Taylor and Rod Berlis.

The Church of St. Andrew and St. Paul was built in 1931-32. Two congregations, St. Andrew's founded in 1803, and St. Paul's founded in 1832, joined together in 1919. This is the Regimental Church of The Black Watch (Royal Highland Regiment) of Canada, whose colours hang in the sanctuary. The church organ is a four-manual 1932 Casavant (completely rebuilt in 2000) with 112 ranks and 7000 pipes spread over eight divisions, located in the chancel and the gallery.


