The Church of St. Andrew and St. Paul

The Church of St. Andrew and St. Paul was built in 1931-32. Two congregations, St. Andrew's founded in 1803, and St. Paul's founded in 1832, joined together in 1919. This is the Regimental Church of The Black Watch (Royal Highland Regiment) of Canada, whose colours hang in the sanctuary. The church organ is a four-manual 1932 Casavant (completely rebuilt in 2000) with 112 ranks and 7000 pipes spread over eight divisions, located in the chancel and the gallery.

About this morning's organ and choral music...

March 8 is International Women's Day, and in honour of the occasion our service music this month celebrates works composed by women.

Born to Canadian parents in Rochester, NY, **Florence Durell Clark** (1891-1977) was raised, trained and lived in southern Ontario. She completed a BMus at University of Toronto, studying composition and violin with Sir Ernest MacMillan, Ella Howard and others. Her professional activities included composition, orchestral string playing, and a variety of church positions. The language of this morning's ably-composed preludes is inspired by the early 20th-century English school, represented in Canada by Healey Willan, MacMillan and others.

Born to a middle-class Parisian family, **Mel Bonis** initially taught herself piano. Her great talent soon became apparent, and she studied at the Paris Conservatoire with César Franck, among others. Her oeuvre includes over 300 compositions, for many different instrumental and vocal combinations. Given its sumptuous melodic writing, instrumentation and para-liturgical text in French (rather than Latin), it is unlikely that this morning's anthem was originally intended for church performance. The scoring is for organ (harmonium), harp, SATB choir and soprano solo, suggesting a salon-style performance among friends and music lovers.

Jean Racine is one of the great French dramatists of the 17th century; the crystalline imagery of his language can scarcely be translated. The poem sung this morning juxtaposes our human weakness and Divine grace, a fitting theme for this first Sunday in Lent.

Raffaella Aleotta may well have been the same person, or elder sister to **Vittoria Aleotti** (c.1575 – after 1620). In either case, she was an Italian Augustinian nun who studied with Ercole Pasquini, one of the great 17th c. Italian composers. She was the music director for many year at her convent of St. Vito in Ferrara, where she gained fame for her published compositions, her keyboard virtuosity, and her skill in leading a musical ensemble of 23 nuns.

Stephanie Martin is a major presence in Canadian choral and liturgical music. For many years she served as Director of Music at the Anglo-Catholic church of St. Mary Magdalene in Toronto (made famous as a centre for liturgical beauty during Healey Willan's long tenure); from 1997-2017 she conducted Toronto's Pax Christi Chorale; and at present she serves as Associate Professor of Music at York University. This morning's simple motet is dedicated to the choir of St. Mary's, and evokes the medieval genre of fauxbourdon, in which a chant melody is "shadowed" in parallel intervals.

Eleanor Daley (b. 1955) is a prolific Toronto-based composer best known for her choral works. However, she is also an accomplished organist, pianist and conductor. This morning's postlude is the third movement of her *Triptych*, commissioned in 1998 by Lawrence Park Community Church in Toronto to celebrate the inauguration of the church's new Casavant organ. The energetic toccata is inspired by the text of Acts 2:17, "And I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh".
